



Greater Family Health Offers Additional Support to Pregnant Women and Infants

Family Case Management (FCM) is a statewide program that provides comprehensive service coordination to improve the health, social, educational, and developmental needs of pregnant women, and infants (0 - 12 months) from low-income families in the communities of Illinois.


Family Case Management develops close working relationships with physicians, hospitals and other specialty medical providers. FCM also collaborates with community agencies to address barriers in accessing medical services, child care, transportation, housing, food, mental health needs and substance use disorder services.

Who is eligible for Family Case Management?

- Pregnant women who qualify for Medicaid or the WIC Program
- Families with a child under the age of one who qualify for Medicaid or the WIC Program
- Families do not need to be a patient of Greater Family Health to benefit from the Family Case Management program.
